I'm making a way in the desert, paths in the wilderness.




As an update, we received 29 pledge commitments for 2025 which included financial and ministry interest. The financial part of the pledges was approximately \$163,000. Our goal was 50 pledges and \$240,000. History indicates another 25 individuals who support the church each year who we expect will continue to do so. Combined giving totals approximately \$258,000 towards our 2025 operating budget of \$297,000. A heartfelt thanks to each of you for your planned and continued financial support!

Remember our goals as we move forward – they are: 1) expand participation in ministry areas,


- 2) increase visitation and membership, 3) continue small group growth,

Dear Foundry Family and Friends,

To keep you informed, below is a brief financial update through November along with other

comments regarding 2025.

We have been very supportive of ministries within our community, U.S. disaster relief, our missionary, and certain other needs. We raised \$40,193 through November. We expect more donations to be received through December.

We were unable to support all ministries within our Virginia Methodist Conference. We provided \$5,082 in support towards our requested obligations of \$46,704. However, more donations are expected from the Christ Child offering.

With your help, we plan to provide regular monthly support to our Virginia Conference in 2025.

We received a donation of \$5,000 from Beach Ford in December as a thank-you and appreciation for being a good neighbor especially during the recent large construction project.

Our 2025 Operating Budget is \$297,266 or \$814 per day. It costs a minimum of \$655 per day to maintain our church facility and provide weekly worship services.

Our pledge commitments for 2025 along with other expected offerings currently total approximately \$258,000, a shortfall of \$39,000 towards our budget of \$297,000. Please make every effort to fulfill your pledge for 2025.

Most importantly, a sincere thanks for your generosity and continued support of Foundry's ministries. Each of you support our church in your own way – time, talents, services, prayers and financial gifts. Every type is vital and important to our ministries as we are in ministry together sharing the good news of our faith with others.


A Message From Your Missions Chair

The fall and winter season have seen the usual "flurry" of Missions activities, beginning with the **Annual Apple Sale**. We realized a profit of \$1880, all of which will be donated to Wings of Caring Aviation Ministry in the Democratic Republic of Congo. We hope to contribute towards the purchase of a new turbine-



powered airplane which can use

more widely available jet fuel. Jacques Umembudi, our missionary on that project, has extended his thanks and has written:

enthusiasm. The pandemic significantly reduced sales and they have not returned to pre-pandemic levels. On the other hand, we have a contingent of loyal customers in the congregation and the community who appreciate the high quality of the products from Dickie Brothers Orchard and Ann's Apple Butter and understand that our profits go toward an extremely worthwhile cause. Any ideas to increase sales in the future would be greatly appreciated!





Food Pantry is experiencing its typical pre-holiday spike in guest numbers. We recognize that we all typically purchase a lot more food in preparation for Thanksgiving and Christmas and our guest families are no different. Thanks to your financial support, we now purchase or receive food from Operation Blessing, Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia, and Walmart, in addition to donated food. We received a mind-boggling amount of food donated

by the Hampton Roads Community to the Foodbank's Mayflower Marathon, just in time for Thanksgiving when our food stores were getting low. Each food shipment is an exercise in logistics, heavy (and light) lifting, allocation of storage spaces, and the cheerful willingness and cooperation of all the volunteers who make it happen. You should see the scurrying around when food is removed from the trucks, deposited in a freezer or on a pantry shelf, or set aside for repackaging into smaller portions for distribution. If you haven't been in on this action, give it a try! Yes, many hands make light work, but I for one also have a great time in camaraderie with my Foundry friends. 
